Dear Colleagues,

We send you this fifth circular letter to announce the launch of the [online registration platform](#) for the Origeniana Duodecima and the excursion to Caesarea. Since the conference is less than one month away, we kindly request that you register as soon as possible, and no later than Thursday, June 15. Only once conference presenters are registered will we be able to assign them in the conference program. We apologize for the short notice and stress that this registration process is designed to ensure that we all enjoy a well-organized and successful conference.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the conference registration and excursion fees.

**Conference Fee:**

The conference fee is set at **130 USD**. As mentioned in previous letters, the fee will cover participation in all sessions, dinner reception, coffee, and lunch during the conference (at the Maierdorf Faculty Club).

Students and post-doctorates are exempt from the conference fee and are invited to all receptions and meals but are nonetheless required to register through the online platform. Students who will be attending the conference but will not be presenting are required to pay the full conference fee.

**Excursion Fee:**

The excursion to Caesarea will take place on Thursday, June 29, and is expected to end between 16:00 and 18:00. Please make sure to equip yourselves with a hat, sunscreen, water bottles and comfortable walking shoes. We suggest that participants with a return flight that departs before 21:00 on Thursday forgo the excursion.

The fee for the Caesarea excursion is **35 USD** and includes lunch. Students and post-doctorates who wish to join the excursion are required to pay the excursion fee. Partners and guests are welcome to join for the same fee. The online registration platform includes the option to add guests and pay accordingly.

The deadline for the excursion registration is also Thursday, June 15.
